Nearly 500 people attended the country chic fundraiser held on Good Shepherd's campus that was hosted by the hospital and Advocate Charitable Foundation, and co-chaired by Kim Duchossois and Dr. Barry Rosen, breast surgeon and vice president of medical management at Good Shepherd Hospital. Generous lead sponsors Barbie and Paul Hills, Dayle and Edward Fortino, the Foglia Family, Janet and Craig Duchossois, Nan and Wayne Kocourek, and Elizabeth and Jim Bramsen helped make the event a huge success.

James Taylor showcased several of his well-known songs and shared stories about working with the Beatles' Apple label. His performance was generously underwritten by an anonymous donor. Each year more than 33,000 patients, including 9,000 children, receive care in the ED. The renovations will improve patient care by creating seven private rapid treatment rooms and will include a redesigned registration area. The project will increase patient safety and improve health outcomes, offering more efficient triage, privacy, and comfort. U
